Virginia Tech Awards for Exemplary Academic Advising: Call for Nominations

Nomination Deadline for all Awards: January 15, 2010

Each year, the university recognizes the importance of advising excellence through the awards described below.

- **To make a nomination, visit the appropriate link to print the nomination form and submit it to Kimberly Brown, Director of University Academic Advising Center/University Studies by January 15, 2010.**
- **Completed nominating packets and supporting materials, including but not limited to nomination forms, dossier, and letters of support must be submitted by February 12, 2010 for review by the selection committee.**

Alumni Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Academic Advising: for excellence in undergraduate advising. The nominee must be a full-time faculty member and must hold the rank of professor, associate professor, assistant professor or instructor.

One award of \$2000 is given each year. The awardee also will receive membership in the Academy of Advising Excellence. The committee reviews nominations made by students, alumni, faculty, departments, or self-nominations, and selects a recipient. An individual who has received any one of these awards is ineligible for another major award for a period of seven years and can receive any particular award only once.

Alumni Award for Excellence in Graduate Academic Advising: for excellence in graduate advising. The nominee must be a full-time faculty member and must hold the rank of professor, associate professor, assistant professor or instructor.

One award of \$2000 is given each year. The awardee also will receive membership in the Academy of Advising Excellence. The Advising Award committee reviews nominations made by students, alumni, faculty, departments, or self-nominations, and selects a recipient. An individual who has received any one of these awards is ineligible for another major award for a period of seven years and can receive any particular award only once.

The Provost's Award for Excellence in Advising: to recognize an individual who serves undergraduate advisees in exemplary ways. Priority consideration is given to full-time AP faculty members.

One award that includes a \$2,000 cash prize, a plaque, and membership in the University's Academy of Advising Excellence is given each year. The nominee must be faculty (Instructor or other rank) or a classified staff member with assigned undergraduate advising responsibilities. The Provost's Award for Excellence in Advising is given annually to recognize an individual who serves undergraduate advisees in exemplary ways.
